

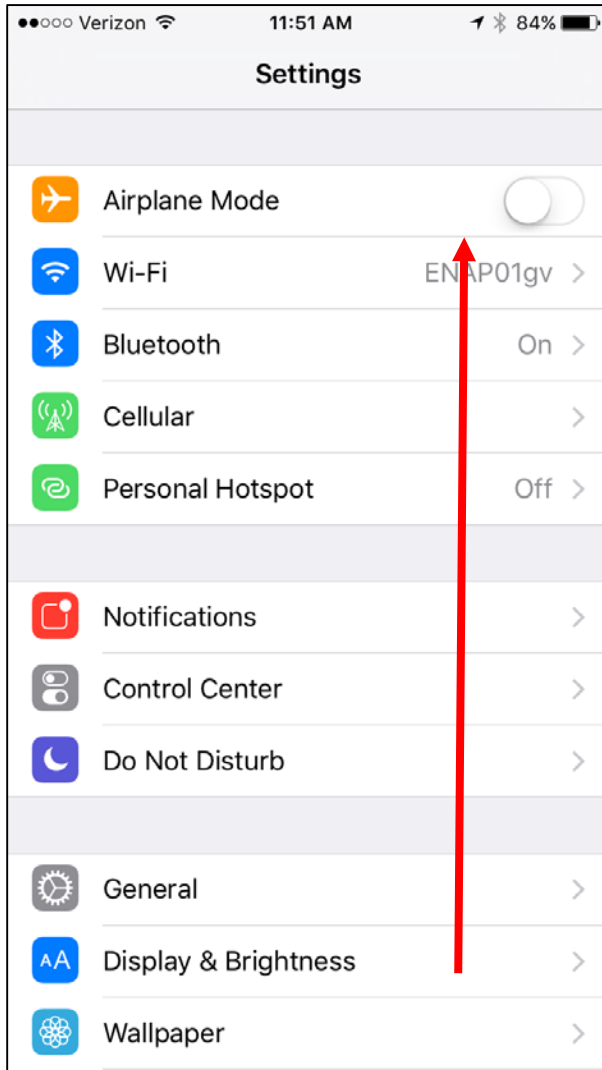
Passport Companion – iPhone App

How to Change Your App's Settings

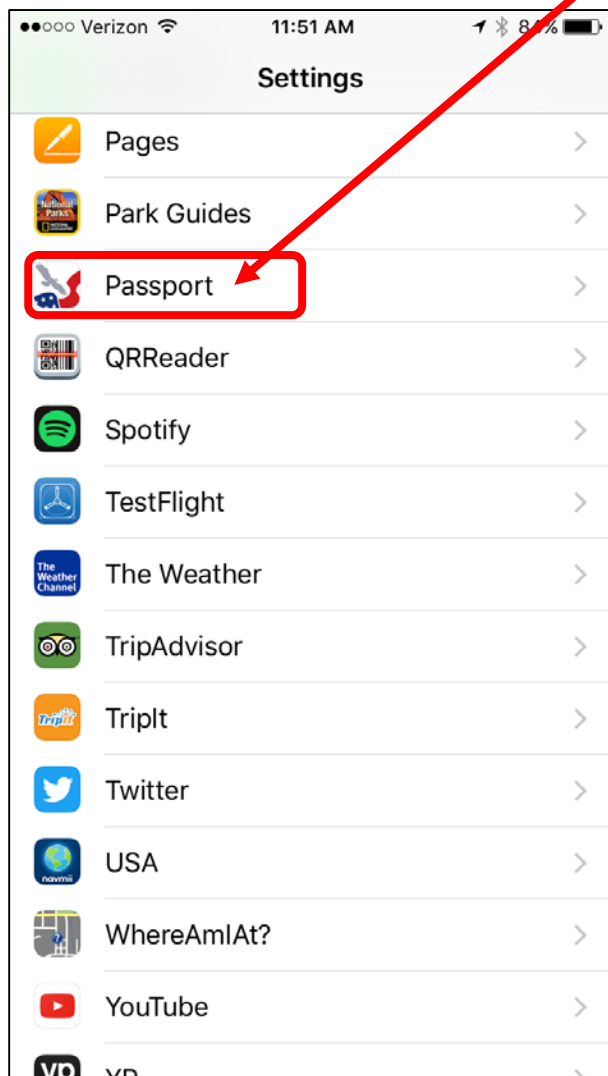
1. To make changes to your Passport App's settings, tap on the Settings icon on your device's home display.



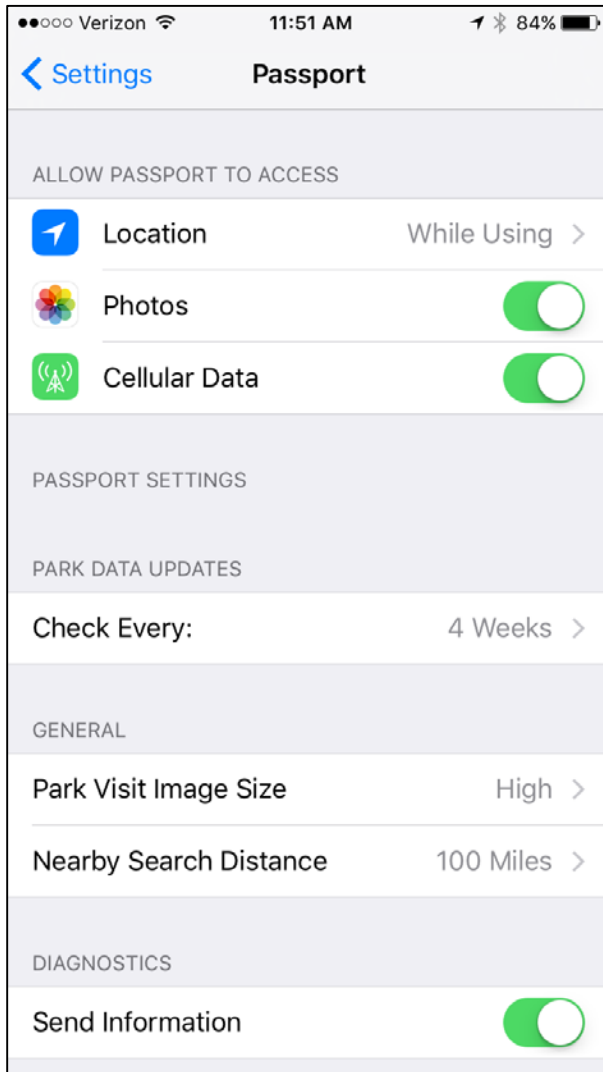
2. Below are the Settings for your iPhone or iPad. Scroll to the bottom to the Apps area.



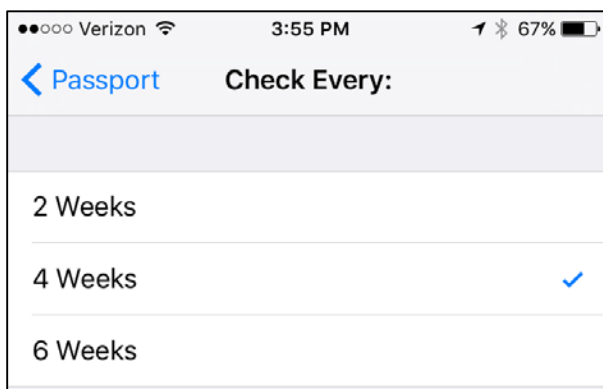
3. Down in the Apps area you will see listed the Passport App. Tap on the icon.



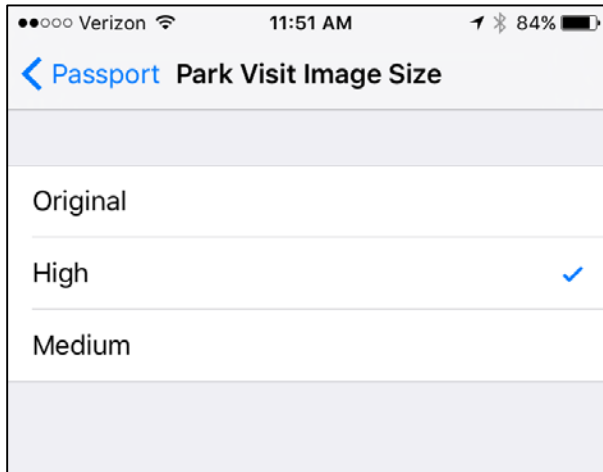
4. The top 3 items are used to allow the Passport App to access certain information on your device.
 - a. Location – use your current GPS location will allow the “Nearby” function to work.
 - b. Photos – will allow you to access your photos to add photos to your visits.
 - c. Cellular Data – will allow you to use your data plan when not connected to wifi.



5. The Passport Settings set the App’s defaults.
 - a. The “Check Every” option is defaulted to 4 weeks. That will check the Eastern National website to see if there are any updates to the park database every 4 weeks. When the President of the U.S. creates a new National Monument, etc., this will add a new park to the database. You can choose 2, 4, or 6 weeks.



- b. Park Visit Image Size is used to set the size of the photos that are in the app when you add a photo to a visit. Adding photos to visits will consume space on your device. The resolution for Medium may be enough if you only view the photos on your phone. If you view the photos on an iPad, you may wish to change the resolution to High. You would only use Original if you want to connect your device to an HD or 4K TV and display the photos on a big screen. But beware: if you store many photos within the app (by adding the photos to your park visit in the app), a setting of Original could fill up your device's memory. If you know that you need the Original, you may want to consider a 64GB or 128GB device.



- c. Nearby Search Distance is used when you tap on Nearby on the Cancellations Locations map.
